Regulatory costs of Euro 7: Findings from an industry survey

Frontier Economics published an evaluation of incremental costs per new Euro 7 vehicle based on estimates by industry experts. CLEPA & McKinsey: Pulse Check

CLEPA (European Association of Automotive Suppliers) and McKinsey's semi-annual survey shows nearly half of suppliers expect profits to remain low, with nearly one quarter expecting losses in 2023.
