Analysing the economic competitiveness of truck decarbonization pathways in Europe

A new ICCT study examines the total cost of ownership (TCO) for various European truck classes. The TCO analysis in the paper covers several HDV segments, including tractor trailers operating in long-haul with gross vehicle weight (GVW) reaching 40 tonnes, rigid trucks operating in regional delivery and urban delivery, and light-duty trucks operating in urban delivery. These HDV segments were chosen to ensure comprehensive coverage of the different HDV applications in Europe while focusing on the segments with the highest sales shares. While economic activity is expected to gradually recover going forward, the European Commission's Autumn Forecast revises EU GDP growth down compared to its summer projections.
